Help Us Build Our Audience and Keep the Music Playing!

Dear Friends and Supporters;

All of us at the Gallery Players sincerely hope this finds you and your family in good health. It's been a difficult few years for many of us, but we feel hopeful that sharing beautiful music together in an intimate space will help lift spirits in our community. Thank you for being part of our journey thus far.

As we announce this season's concerts, I'm writing to tell you about a bold, new Accessibility Initiative that will broaden access to our concerts, build our audience, and ensure that we're still thriving and ready to celebrate our 30th anniversary with you in 2024-2025.

We believe that access to art is a human right, and that the experience of live music enriches lives and strengthens communities. But for some, cost is a barrier to access. Some of our "pandemic time" has been spent searching for ways to remove that barrier so that everyone who wishes to can share the delights - and benefits - of our music making.

The goal of our Accessibility Initiative is to ensure that everyone in our Niagara community is able to experience **exhilarating, engaging, moving, truly glorious music,** irrespective of means. To this end we have reduced the cost of our subscriptions and introduced a "pay-what-you-choose-to" concert admission on the day of each performance. While some people will choose to pay less than the suggested price, we hope that those who are able will pay the full amount. You will notice on our ticket order form that we've clearly marked the savings (over last year's prices) and invite those with the financial means to convert their savings to a donation and receive a tax receipt.

We have planned an exciting season of concerts for 2022-2023 and are enthusiastic about this initiative for sharing our concerts with a much broader audience. We are already working hard to identify and engage with potential new concert-goers and welcome them into the Gallery Players family. In addition, to ensure we have the financial resources to meet our commitment to engage top professional artists and pay them appropriately, we will energetically seek funds from private foundations, corporations, and government funders, all of which have shown interest in supporting our desire to grow and diversify our audience.

I can't say this too often: **Thank-You** to everyone who has continued to support the Gallery Players. You, our patrons, are part of a very special community that underpins everything we do. Despite all the pandemic upheavals, with your help we've managed to keep the music playing, and to dream of a better future. Together we can make that dream happen!

The 1630 plague outbreak in Northern Italy devastated Venice: one third of the population succumbed to disease. With obvious parallels to the present day, we explore expressions of faith set to music by Schütz and his Venetian contemporaries Monteverdi, Grandi, and Cifra. **Performers:** Sheila Dietrich and Lindsay McIntyre, sopranos; Jennifer Enns Modolo, alto; Bud Roach, tenor and Artistic Director (Capella Intima); David Roth and Paul Winkelmans, baritones; Julie Baumgartel and Rona Goldensher, violins; Margaret Gay, 'cello; Jonathan Stuchbery, theorbo; Borys Medicky, organ. *Online 48 hours after the concert.*

THE SCAR of SHAME (Frank Perugini, 1929) 86 minutes Produced by Colored Players Film Corporation, Philadelphia. We continue our fascinating journey with live improvised music accompanying a visually stunning social melodrama, featuring an all-Black cast in this 1929 silent film. When an impoverished young woman escapes her abusive father, she is rescued by an aspiring composer. **Performers:** Douglas Miller, flute; Eric Mahar, guitars; Penner Mackay, percussion; Joan Nicks, film critic.

Knafel Professor of Music at Harvard University, explores essentials such as harmony, phrase structure, and the social significance of *Op. 20 #5 string quartet* of Joseph Haydn. This season all performances will start at 3:00pm (except movie night), and run 60-75 minutes in length, without intermissions.

Access to online performances of concerts #1, #4 and #6 will be available 48 hours following the live presentation. This season the online concerts will not be live.


A 3-concert virtual subscription and single virtual tickets are available.
