## Virtue and Vice: Roman oratorio and Venetian extravagance!

A co-production with Capella Intima INTIM

Marking our fourth co-production with Capella Intima we present *Giuseppe*, an oratorio from 1650, discovered in the Vatican Library and attributed to Luigi Rossi. Based on the biblical story of the coat of many colours, this 40-minute, energetic work is scored for five voices, strings, theorbo, and organ. In the second half we feature secular Venetian vocal and instrumental works by Monteverdi, Sances, and their contemporaries lots more 17th century fireworks incorporating the same themes encountered in *Giuseppe*: Envy, Injustice, Faith and Charity. Directed by Bud Roach.

## Bach on Turtle's Back Year 3 - Rebirth

Birth, death and rebirth resonate as universal topics of human expression. Combining the *C major Violin Sonata* and *E major Partita* of J. S. Bach, the choreography of Brian Solomon, and selected Bach arias, "Rebirth" explores and reconciles these profoundly human concerns within a uniquely Canadian context. In this, the third and final concert of our Bach on Turtle's Back project, we are proud to premiere a new commission from Cree composer Andrew Balfour, scored for period string quartet and baritone (performed by Jonathon Adams & the Eybler Quartet). Join us for the culmination of this multi-layered, multi-discipline project, a true feast for the senses.

## Joy, Sorrow, and the Spaces in Between Dior Quartet

Joy and Sorrow are polar opposite emotions, inescapable elements of our existence, both profoundly felt. In a nod to Charlie Chaplin's films, Canadian composer Dinuk Wijeratne's The Disappearance of Lisa Gherardini takes us through the hilarious stages of an infamous heist of the Mona Lisa. How often are we encouraged to laugh in a concert hall? By stark contrast String Quartet No. 2: The Gathering by another leading Canadian, Christos Hatzis, invites us to look at our human history beleaguered by war. The composer draws us in to explore the sounds of ordinary life in contrast to the shadows of conflict. Maurice Ravel's incredible String Quartet in F Major, itself a microcosm of disparate emotions, draws together the divergent strands of the two newer works.


